



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Twenty seventh day of February 1733 surveyed unto Devald Baum a tract of Land situate in Oley in the County of Philad^a. Beginning at a post in the line of a tract of Land laid ^{out} to the Proprietaries use thence by the same North Twenty Degrees west two hundred and twenty perches to a post corner of Jacob Spanglers Land thence by the same North seventy Degrees east two hundred & twenty perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South twenty Degrees East one hundred & twenty perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South seventy Degrees west sixty perches to a white Oak thence by Vacant Land South twenty Degrees ^{East} one hundred perches to a post thence by Vacant Land South Seventy Degrees west one hundred and sixty perches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred & fifty acres with ye usual allowance of six per Cent
