



By virtue of a warrant from the Honorable Proprietaries bearing Date the third Day of October Anno Domini 1738 I have surveyed and laid out unto Leonard Barwitz on a Branch of Codorus Creek in Lancaster County on the west Side Susquehanna river Two hundred and ~~seven~~ <sup>five</sup> ~~quarters~~ <sup>quarters</sup> acres of Land with allowance of six percent Beginning at a Chest<sup>nut</sup>-Oak Thence South fifty nine Degrees West only one hundred and forty perches to a Hickrey Thence South fifteen Degrees Easterly one hundred and sixty perches to a Post Thence North seventy three Degrees Easterly one hundred and eighty perches Thence North forty Degrees Easterly fifty two perches to a White Oak Thence North thirty six Degrees and a half Westly one hundred and seventy five perches and three Quarters to a white Oak Thence South sixty six Degrees West only twenty three perches to the place of Beginning
