



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the 10th. day of Janu^{ry} 1733 Survey'd unto Thomas Thornbury a Tract of Land situate on Conestogoe Creek in the County of Lancaster, Beginning at a post by ye sd. Creek at a corner of Martin Wypreight's Land then by the same N. 84° W. 97 pches to a Black Oak N. 70° W. 100 pches to a Hickory thence South 80° W. five pches to a post, thence S. by E. 60 pches to a post, W. by S. 40 pches to a post then South by East by Jacob Funk's land 64 pches to a Black Oak, thence N. 88° East by John Davies's Land 102 pches to a Spanish Oak, thence S. 75° East 68 pches to a Black Oak, then S. 87° East by Martin Lands Land 120 pches to ~~the~~ ~~place of Beginning~~ a white oak by the said Creek, then up the same 144 pches to the place of Beginning containing one Hundred and Sixty two acres, and the usual allowance for Roads. Survey'd the 24th. day of January 1733/4

Assigned to ~~Thomas Thornbury~~ Michael Earler & a Warrant granted the 10th. of June 1741 to make Return &c for his use. Jno. Taylor
