



By Virtue of a warrant from the Honble. Proprietaries bearing date first day of March Anno. Dom. 1737. I have survey'd and laid out unto John Black three hundred and forty one acres with allowance of six pcent in the Township of Hopewell in the County of Lancaster on the west side Susquehanna River. — Beginning at a white oak being a corner of David Houston's Land thence by vacant land north thirty degrees easterly one hundred and eighty pches (p. 11) a chestnut oak north thirty degrees westerly one hundred and forty two pches to a white oak south fifty degrees westerly one hundred and two p. to a post north fifty degrees westerly ninety one pches and an half to a post north sixty degrees westerly fifty pches to a white oak south thirty degrees westerly one hundred & sixty pches to a Black oak a corner of the sd. Houston's by the same land south sixty degrees easterly two hundred and forty pches to a white oak north thirty degrees easterly sixty pches to a post, thence south sixty degrees easterly seventy seven pches to the place of Beginning Survey'd March 15th 1737 p me Zach. Butcher. Supt. To Benja. Eastburn Surveyor Genl.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this seventh day of January 1902
