



By order of the Proprietaries surveyed to Henry Bear a tract of land in the Township of Hempfield Beginning at a marked black oak thence east north east 18 2 per to a black oak thence south south east 58 per to a hickory thence east north east 100 per to a black oak thence north north west 70 per to a hickory thence west south west 100 per to a black oak thence north north west 78 per to a black oak thence west south west 200 per to a white oak thence south east by south 92 per to the place of Beginning containing one Hundred forty two acres & a half with the usual allowance off six acres pl<sup>t</sup> for roads &c. Surveyed the 20th Day of February Anno Domini 1735 1/6
