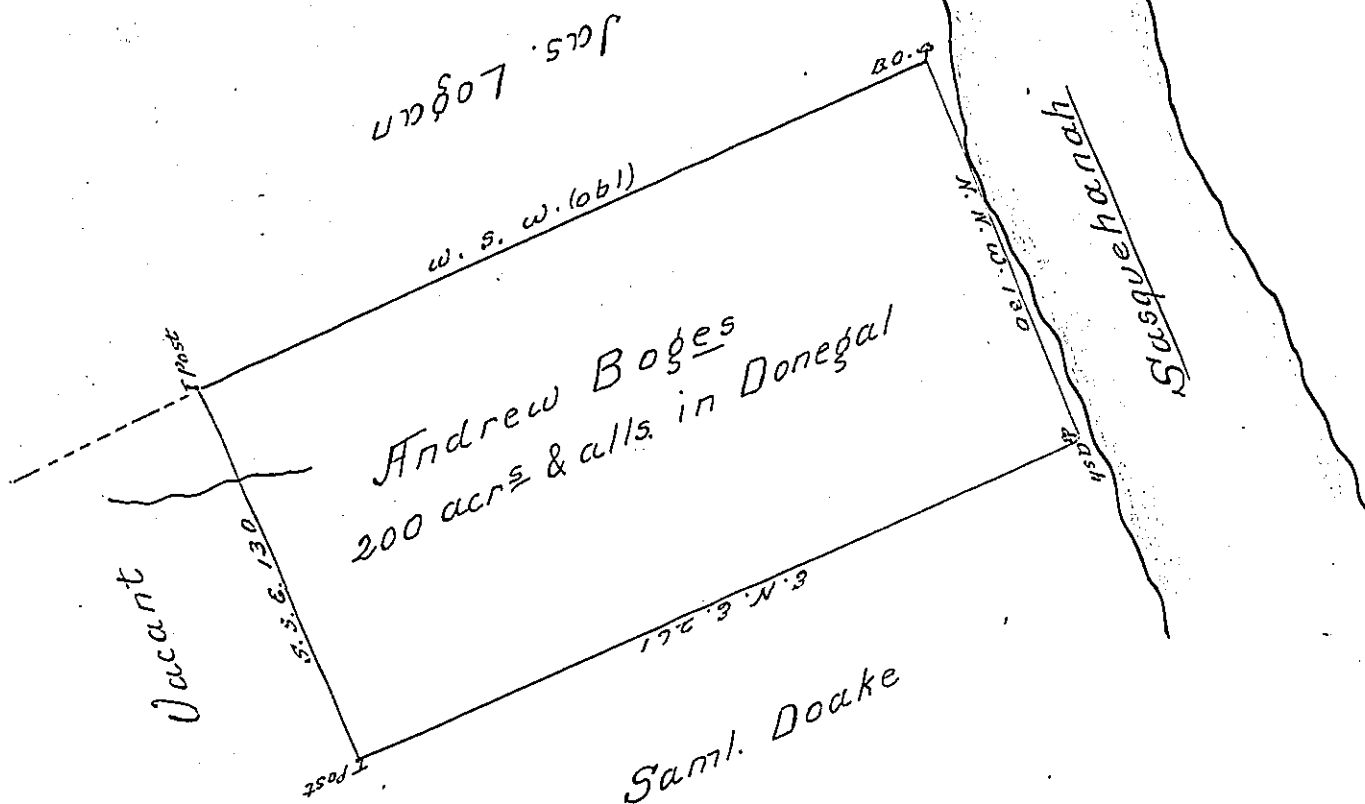

By Virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the twenty first day of August Anno Dom 1738 Surveyed on the eleventh day of April 1739 to Andrew Boges, A Tract of Land situate in the Township of Donegal in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a Black Oak near Susquehanna a corner of James Logans Land Thence up by the sd river North North West one hundred & thirty perches to an ash ^{post} East North East two hundred & sixty one perches to a Post thence South South east one hundred & thirty perches to a ^{in James Logans line} post thence west south west two hundred & sixty one perches to the place of Beginning containing two hundred acres and the allowance of Six acres bent for Roads & Highways
 Surveyed by Sa: Blunston.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this seventh day of January 1902
