



Adraught of a tract of land, situate in the township of Waterford, in the County of Erie, on the waters of French Creek, as Surveyed 13th. Feby 1849 for Watts B. Lloyd and John H. Millar by virtue of a warrant granted them dated the 29th. day of Jany. A. D. 1849.

The tract is bounded and described as follows, to wit: Beginning at a post on the north line of the Moravian Grant, and the S. E. corner of a tract Patented by Thos. King, thence by land of Watts B. Lloyd North $21\frac{1}{2}$ perches to a Pine tree the S. W. corner of a tract Patented by Alexr. McElroy; thence by S. line of said McElroy tract, now the lands of Watts B. Lloyd, Wilson Moore, Thos Moore, Jas. Moore, John Moore & Alexr. Moore N. 57° E 341 perches to a post the S. E. corner of sd. McElroy tract; thence S. $5\frac{1}{2}$ perches to a Buttonwood tree at the S. W. corner of a tract Patented by Andrew Simpson; thence by S. line of said tract, now the lands of Aaron Burrows, Wm. Pratt, Tim. Pratt, & A. C. Newman and by lands of C. W. Hicks and Widow Kendal East 474 perches to a post in road; thence along said road by land of Charles Boyer South 22 perches to a post; thence by the North line of the Moravian Grant West 815 perches to the place of beginning containing One hundred and ten acres of land with the usual allowance of six percent for roads &c.

I, John H. Millar Deputy Surveyor of the County of Erie do certify that the above is a true copy of the survey and the description thereof as noted in the survey Book of Erie County kept by me. I have blocked a number of trees along the north line of the grant and counted their growths which numbered about 50 and appears to be the oldest marked line. The marks on the trees along the north line of the piece appear to be made about 35 years.
