



Vacant Barren Land

By Virtue of a Warrant dated the 9<sup>th</sup> day of March Anno Domini 1742  
 The above described Tract of Land was surveyed for Conrod Rief and Arnold  
 Hufreel in Bern Township in Lancaster County, Beginning at a W.O. thence  
 by Barrens N 73° E 107 per to a W.O. N 59° E 61 per to a post. N 50° E 57 per to a  
 Spanish Oak. S 87° E 61 per to a W.O. S 3° W 10 per to a Hickory East 40 per to a  
 Hickory and S. E. 30 per to a Maple by a small branch of Schuylkill River  
 Thence down the same on the several courses thereof 50 per to a Hickory  
 Thence by Barrens N 82° E 69 per to a W.O. And S. 70° E 41 per to another W.O.  
 Thence due N. crossing a Branch 39 per to a W.O. Thence by Vacant Mountainous  
 Land W. N. W. 50 per to a S.O. S. 70° W. 70 per to a W.O. N. 78° W. 41 per to a W.O.  
 N. 12° E. 92 per to a small Hickory S. 83° W. 76 per to a W.O. N. 3° W 37 per to  
 a Spanish Oak. S. 85° W. 26 per to a Maple. S. E. W. 102 per to a Post. N 77°  
 W. 104 per to a W.O. S. 37° W. 52 per to a W.O. and S. 24° E 94 per to the  
 Place of Beginning Containing 238<sup>ac</sup>
