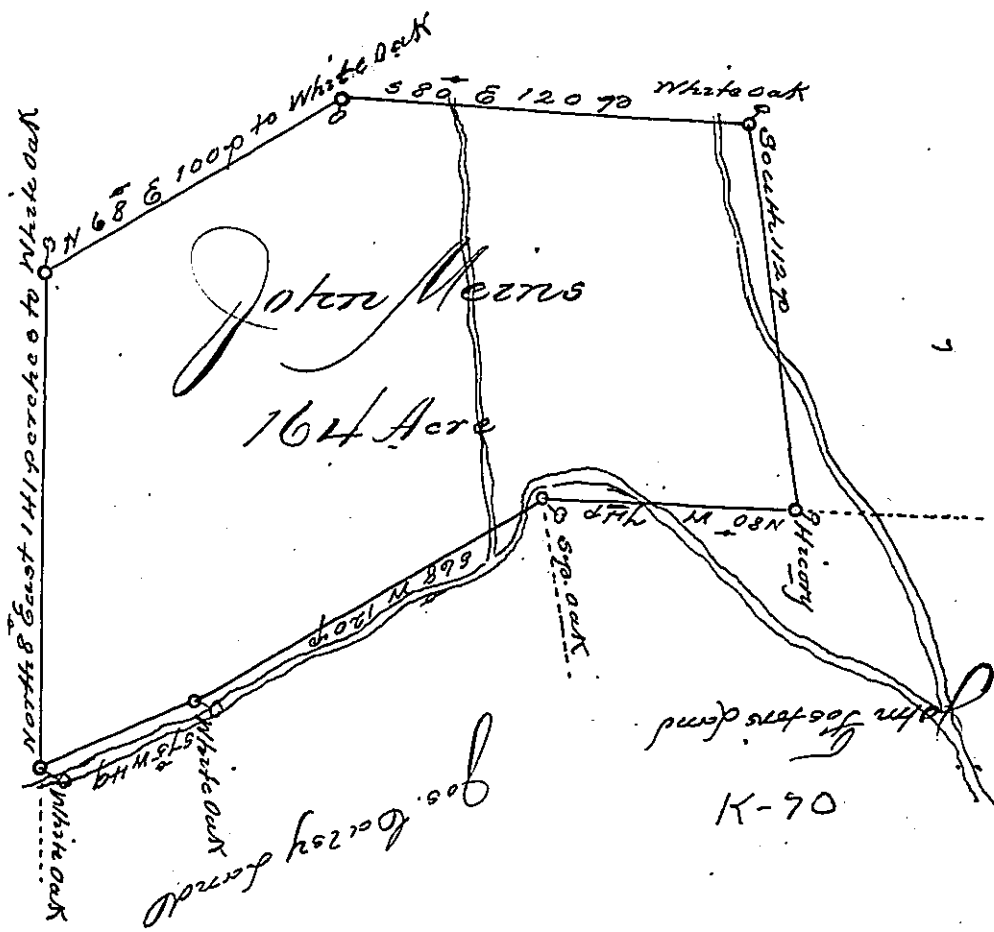

Thence North 80 Degrees Westerly 70 perches to a Spanish Oak. Thence South 68 Degrees Westerly 120 perches to White Oak. Thence South 75 Degrees Westerly 49 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing 164 acres and allowance of six acres for Roads & Highways
