



By virtue of ^{an order} a court from the Hon^{ble} Proprietaries bearing date the eighteenth day of October Anno Domⁱⁿⁱ 1738

I have surveyed and laid out unto Henry Shantz on Cocorus Creek adjoining Thomas Perrings Settlement in the County of Lancaster on the west side Duquehanna river Two Hundred and seventy nine acres of land with allowance of six per cent. Beginning at a Black Oak by the said Creek thence North Sixty four degrees westerly one hundred and eighty one perches to a Hickery, thence north twenty six degrees easterly one hundred and eighty one perches to a Black Oak, thence south sixty four degrees easterly three hundred and forty six perches to a Hickery by the said creek, thence up the same Traversing the severall courses there of near about Two hundred and seventy perches to the place of beginning
