



1/2 of the part marked A. - the dotted line represents part of a survey tract to Benjamin Davis the 14th of Nov^r 1776. Containing three hundred and twenty one acre one hundred and eleven perch of said return within the line of Thos. Clark.

The above described tract of Land was surveyed [under the direction of Mr. Cox Ellis a former deputy surveyor for this County] the 28th day of March 1809 to Thomas Clark in pursuance of his warrant granted to him the 10th day of August 1808. Situate adjoining lands of John Pence in Tippenose or Oval limestone valley in ^{Tippenose} ~~Hays~~ Township Lycoming County containing four hundred and twenty eight acres one hundred and eleven perches with the allowance of six per cent for roads &c. and now at the owners request examined & approved by me this 17th of January 1814
