



A Draught of a Tract of Land Called — Situate on the West Side of the North East Branch of Susquehanna River oppoite an Island about 4 Miles below the mouth of Tunkannock Creek and adjoining Land Survey<sup>d</sup> for John Hammon in the County of Northumberland. Containing two hundred And Eighty two Acres besides the usual allowance of Six & Cent for Roads &c<sup>a</sup> Surveyed the 18<sup>th</sup> Day of November 1774 for Henry Hill. In Pursuance of A Warrant Dated the 17<sup>th</sup> day of March 1774.
