



A Draught of a Tract of land called Haverlings Hall Situate on the Waters of little Shamokin Creek beyond the Narrows and about Seven Miles (by estimation) from Fort Augusta in the County of Northumberland, containing One hundred and sixty two Acres and a half besides the usual allowance of 6<sup>th</sup> Cent for Roads & Surveyed the 7<sup>th</sup> Day of December 1773 for Jacob Haverling. In Pursuance of a Warrant Dated the 8<sup>th</sup> Day of August 1772.
