



By Vertue of a warrant granted to Thomas Billington on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of April A.D. 1800 there was survey<sup>d</sup> unto the said Thomas Billington on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1801 by orders of James Johnston the former Deputy Surveyor (a draft of which survey remaines in my office). The above discribed tract of Eight hundred sixty seven and <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> acres of land and allowance — setuate in Mahoning Township in the County of Indiana. Witness my hand this thirrd day of Aprel A.D. 1811
