



A draught of a Tract Containing 130 1/2 Acres & the allowance of 6<sup>a</sup> pr. Cent. Situate in Little Britain Township in the County of Lancaster heretofore Possess'd by Thomas Whiteside of late purchased by Robert Roberts, being part of a survey originally made in the year 1745, in Pursuance of a Warrant Granted to William Whiteside, bearing Date the 13<sup>th</sup> April 1744, & this Part resurvey'd the 23<sup>d</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> mo. 1783.
