



Situate in Norwegian township, Schuylkill county, containing one hundred and seventy three acres and thirty two perches and the allowance of six per Cent, it being part of a larger tract of land that was originally surveyed on the 5th day of June 1815 in pursuance of a Warrant dated 23rd day of May 1815 granted to John Adams as appears from a Draught on record in my office. Divided off the 11th day of June 1828 and returned for Michael Heberling.
