



A Draught of a Tract of Land. Situate in Maccongy Township in the County of Northampton, in the State of Pennsylvania. Containing Forty Nine Acres and 94 perches and the usual Allowance, which was Surveyed on the 17<sup>th</sup> Novemb<sup>r</sup> 1756. (by order of W<sup>m</sup> Parsons Esq<sup>r</sup> for George Kibler) or rather Philip Kibler) By Virtue of a Warrant granted to him, dated on the 4<sup>th</sup> June Anno. 1754. The same was afterwards resurveyed and Divided. The greatest part There of is now belonging to George Gorr Junior, and the Remainder to George Kibler, The Son of Philip Kibler.
