



In pursuance of an Act of Assembly passed on the 17th day of March 1820 Authorizing Jacob Spangler, Thomas Smith and Robert Orr Jun^r to make partition of the real Estate of George Bryan Esq^r late of the City of Phila^a (deceas'd) And Allot to each of the heirs their particular Shares of said Estate, And Agr^eeable to the report of the said Jacob Spangler, Thomas Smith and Robert Orr Jun^r from a Diagram by them made, and is entered on record in this County, it appears that lot No^o two was Allotted to and became the Share of George Bryan. Therefore And conformable to the foregoing, Surveyed to George Bryan on the 6th day of August 1825 the above described tract of land containing three hundred And sixty three Acres one hundred and thirty four perches and Allowance of Six P^r Cent^e being lot Number two, the North West part And A third of A larger tract Originally Surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Arthur Bryan dated 20th Oct^r 1785. No^o 685 situate Adjoining lands of the heirs of Edw^d Bleakney, Philip Shoemaker And others on the Waters of Mahoning Creek. Red Bank Township Armstrong County.
