



Pursuant to an Order Dated the 17th Day of March 1746. The two smallest of the above Described Tracts of Land were Surveyed for Nicholas Clea In Bern Township In Lancaster County. The Norther most where of Begins at a White Oak Thence by Vacant Land the three following Courses & Distances Viz. N. 12 Degrees West 49 perches to a Hickery. And S. 78 Degrees West 49 perches to a Stone. Thence S. 12 Degrees East 49 perches to a Hickery. Thence N. 78 Degrees East by other Land of sd Clea. 49 perches to the Beginning &c. The other Begins at a White Oak Thence East by Vacant Land & Land of sd Clea. 38 perches to a White Oak &c.

By Virtue of a Warrant Dated the 13th Day of May Anno Dom. 1747 The Largest of the above Described tracts of Land was Surveyed for Nicholas Clea in The Township Afforesaid Beginning at a Black Oak a Corner of John Althouses Land. Thence S. 63 Degrees West by Vacant Land 48 per. to a Post. Thence N. 50 Degrees West by D^o(L^d) 25 perches to a Hickery In the Line of other Land of sd Clea &c.
