



In pursuance of an Order No 168 date 3^d Ap^l 1769, was surveyed on the 19 Octo^r. 1770 by Robert McCrea (the then Deputy Surveyor of that District) on Loyalhanna or Ligonier Creek then in the County of Bedford, but now in the County of Westmoreland for Loveday Allen all that part of the above described Tract of Land which lays between the Creek and the dotted Lines, containing Two hundred and forty nine acres & 159 p^e with the usual Allow^{ce} of Six acres p. Cent &c. but as that Survey did not contain the quantity which her Order Called for and she having applied to me (by her assignee) to make such addition Therefo as she was justly intitled to I have therefore run the line S. 37 1/4. W. 259 p^e. from the Oak Grub on the Creek side to the black Oak Tree at the south Westerly end thereof - thereby adding the quantity of seventy two acres & 95 p^e which makes in the whole the quantity of three hundred and twenty two acres and ninety one perches with the usual Allowance of six acres p. Cent, for Roads and Highways
