That part where the letter B is placed represents the Land Originally surveyed by Lewis Lewis, said to be Deputy Surveyor for Charles Luckens late D.S., deceased the 17th. day of October, Anno Domini, 1767 to Jacob Hurst In Pursuance of his application No. 3088 for 300^a bearing date the 18th. day of March, A^oD^o, 1767. being wood Land adjoining called Lofly Mountain - And that part where the letter A is placed being an addition to the above described application, Surveyed by the said Lewis Lewis the 19th. day of June A^oD^o, 1769. The parts A and B being now examined, Protracted and Corrected and by our calculation find them to contain as set forth in the above Diagram ~ That part where the Letter C is placed, represents the other addition to the said recited application as surveyed by the said Lewis Lewis (vol. ~~erated~~) th. day of June, A^oD^o, 1769.

And now at the request of John Hurst, one of the Heirs and legal Representatives of the said Jacob Hurst, deceased, we are desired to make return of the Draughts on the 13th. day of August, A^oD^o, 1802.
