



Brought of a tract of land situate on Huntlocks Creek in the township of Union in the County of Luzerne and adjoining land surveyed for William Chambers containing one hundred and fifty acres & eighty three perches of land besides the usual allowance &c - Surveyed the above described tract of land the 29th day of May A.D. 1828 for Alexander Hunter by virtue of his warrant dated the 9th day of June 1773 and in pursuance of the authority vested in me by the Board of Property under the act of Assembly of the 22nd of March 1820 entitled "An act directing the recovery of principle and interest due the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of locations and other office titles issued from under the Proprietary Government and for other purposes" and the supplement thereto passed the 11th day of April 1825-
