



A Draught of a tract land situate in Derry Township, Mifflin County. Containing one hundred and thirty acres and five perches and the allowance of six p. Cent for roads &c, Survey, the 24th of April 1804, in pursuance of a warrant granted to Agnes Frampton dated the 21st day of January 1804.

 An old improvement (call'd Ludimores) consisting of a dwelling house and about three or four acres of cleared land, with 10 or 12 apple trees standing, said to be the property of Agnes Frampton who resides thereon at this time.
 A } Were an old improvement is said to have once been, but now entirely gone.

N.B. All the above tract of land is included in a re-survey made by me the 6th of July 1803, and the 24th of April 1804, pursuant to an order of the Board of Property dated the 18th of April 1803, on the petition of James Burns, said to be the purchaser of a tract of land granted to Samuel Beard by warrant dated the 24th of March 1789, bounded by lands of John Mitchell and others and Survey'd under a special order from the Board to Mr Power.
