



Surveyed on the Nineteenth Day of March 1733 To John Finney a Tract of Land Situate on the East side of ye River Skulkill near Oley in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Beginning at a hickory standing on ye Bank of the s<sup>d</sup>. River - thence by Vacant Land North Seventy Degrees East two hundred and Sixty eight Perches to a White Oak Sapling Thence by Vacant Land South Twenty Degrees one hundred & seventy four Perches to a post being a Corner of Samuel Finneys Land thence by ye same South Seventy Degrees West three hundred & Ten perches to a Black Walnut standing on the Bank of ye s<sup>d</sup> River thence by the several Courses of the same to ye first mentioned hickory - containing three hundred Acres with usual Allowance

This tract of Land was procured to be Survey'd Nich<sup>o</sup> Scull by Thomas Lawrence who is to pay for the same

Warrant dated 1<sup>st</sup> June 1733 granted to Samuel Finney
