



Situate in Hopewell Township in the County of York, that part where the letter *A*, is placed, within the red lines in the above diagram containing 12⁰ & 47⁰ pches and allowance &c. and represents a piece of land which James McCausie claims, in pursuance of a Warrant for 300⁰ directing to be surveyed in six pieces or surveys dated the 11th day of June A.D. 1788. Which was surveyed on the 25th and 26th days of October A.D. 1804. In the presence of, and by the direction as well of the said James McCausie as of Conrad Noons who holds in right of John Philips. And that part included within the black lines when the letter *B*, is placed contains 68⁰ & 60⁰ & allow⁰ and represents the land surveyed on the same days for the said Conrad Noons in pursuance of a Warrant granted to John Philips for 60⁰ dated the 26th day of June A.D. 1788. We further beg leave to state, that Conrad Noons claims the whole of the land above described as well the part *A*, as the part *B*, in pursuance of the Warrants aforesaid, the lines and out-boundaries of the whole appear to have been regularly run and marked some years since. Yet the line true have not been blocked, at the time of the survey
