



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Twenty seventh day of February 1733 Surveyed unto George Clapp a Tract of Land Situate on the east side of the River Skullkill in the County of Philadelphia Beginning at a Hickory on the Bank of the said River thence by land laid out for the Proprietaries Use North Seventy Degrees East one hundred and ninety one perches to a white Oak a corner of said Tract Thence by vacant Land north Seventy Degrees West one hundred and Thirty Three perches to a post thence by vacant Land South Seventy Degrees West Three hundred & Twenty perches to a hickory corner standing on the Bank of S^d River thence down the several courses of the same to the place of Beginning containing Two hundred acres with the usual Allowance of six perches —
