

By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries dated the Territy senuth day of February 1733 Surveyed unto George Clapp a Tract of Land Situate on the east side of the River Skulkill in the Country of Philadelphia Beginning at a Hickory on the Bank of the said River thence by land laid out for the Proprietaries Use North Seventry Degrees East one lundred and mintry one perclus to a white Oak a corner of said Track There be reclus to a post thence by Pacant West one lundred and thirty Three perclus to a post thence by Pacant Land South Seventry Degrees West Three lundred & Inventry perclus to a tickory corner standing on the Bank of 5° River thence Down the several Courses of the same to the place of Beginning Containing Two lundred acres with the Usual allowance of Six Ploent—
