McKeen Esq. as appears by the Official Draught & Certificate of John McKeen Esq. formerly D.S. In pursuance of a Warrant granted to John Martin (alias Morton) dated & obliterated 1794 & confirmed & returned (agreeably to the old course) this 22nd day of Jan. 1830.
