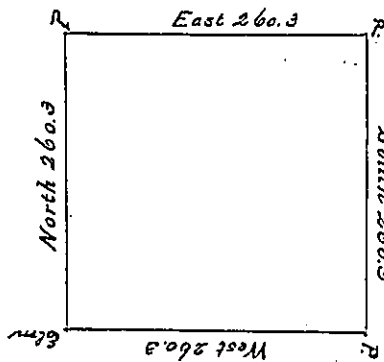


Donation Land

The above described tract of Land situate in my district Beaver County, adjoining Land granted to William N. Wells called Orleans containing 400 Acres with the usual Allowance was sur<sup>d</sup> by John Redick & myself under the Direction of John Hoge Esq<sup>r</sup> late Deputy Surveyor in the month of March 1795 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to John Dorsey dated the 25<sup>th</sup> day of April 1793 which survey was returned into y<sup>e</sup> Sur<sup>or</sup> Gen<sup>l</sup> Office by said Hoge as if survey'd in May 1791. The last mentioned date of survey being erroneous I do now certify and return this survey into the Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> Office for the purpose of correcting said error in compliance with the order of the Board of Property dated the 8<sup>th</sup> day of June 1803
