



Survey'd the above Described Island on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of June 1845 in pursuance of a warrant granted to William Devling on the 17<sup>th</sup> of June 1845. Containing Five Acres & Seventeen perches (called Richard<sup>d</sup> Island) situate near the middle of Bald Eagle Creek (a branch of the Susquehanna) about four miles from the mouth of T. Speck the farm of the d. Richards on the South in Centre County the <sup>farm of</sup> James Carshaden on the North in Bald Eagle Township Luzerne County: Improved and in p<sup>oss</sup>ession of Frederick Ric<sup>h</sup>ards
