



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in Marlborough Township in the County of Philadelphia and Province of Pennsylvania Being Part of 150 Acres at first surveyed for Michael Nusbock. The above part thereof was then taken up by Casper Noy. But is now to be granted to Isaac Sommy: Beginning at a hickory Sapling a corner of the said Isaac Sommy's other Land. Thence by the same North West 87 perches to a Post a corner of Mathew Walker's Land. Thence by the same North East 61 perches to a Stone set for a corner of Conrad Redman's Land (late deceased) Thence by the same South East 172 perches to a stone in the Line of late Christopher Newman now John Yeakle's Land. Thence by the same South West to a dead hickory 38 perches and North West 85 perches to a post. Thence by the same Land South West 23 perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing Fifty Acres and 54 Perches of Land together with the usual allowance at Six per Cent for Roads. Resurveyed for the said Isaac Sommy on the 3^d Day of July Anno. 1759.
