In pursuance of a Warrant for 100<sup>ac</sup> Granted to Paltzer Kneitzer (alias) Baltzer Kneitzer dated the 8<sup>th</sup> day of May 1742. Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger Tract of Land on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of April 1814. at the request of the present owner John Jacoby who desired that the same should be returned for Confirmation as calculated examined and found to be correct on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of January A.D. 1819. —
