



The above is a representation of two tracts of land interfering with each other. Situated in Hopewell township Washington County

The Green lines embrace a tract of land which appears to have been Surveyed by William Sinclair the 3rd day of June A. D. 1786, on a Virginia certificate granted to Patrick M. Garighan - The compartment marked B, is Patented, to the red line the other containing 201^{ac} 132^{ps}. Strict measure appears not to have been Patented under the Virginia Survey -

The black lines embrace a tract of land Surveyed 14th Oct^r 1784 to Joseph Scott on a Warrant dated 24th Sept^r 1784.

That portion of the land lying between the Green and black lines, viz. from a Cherry tree at M. with the Green lines adjoining lands of John Stewart, Archibald Brownlee and David Wilson to a Post at the intersection of the red line, thence with the red line ^{71^{ps}} to a Post at the crossing or intersection of the black line, thence with the black lines to the aforesaid cherry tree containing thirty three Acres one hundred and twenty five perches Strict measure appears to remain unpatented. Surveyed the 19th September A. D. 1821.
