



A Draught of a tract of Land, Situate in Perry Township, Mifflin County, which appears from field notes remaining in my office to have been Surveyed 22^d Feb^y 1797 for James McCalley by James C. Nelson, said to contain three hundred ninety two acres, forty one perches & allon; Examined in part 18th June 1818 at the request of Mrs. Brisson in pursuance of a Warrant in the name of James McCalley, put into my hands 8th June 1818 by said Brisson and found to interfere with a Survey which appears to be made for Dorris Buchanan 27th Dec^r 1774 on Order N^o 1806 dated 14th Nov^r 1766, as above laid down; Examined in part & corrected 28th January 1814, and appears to contain three hundred seven acres, one hundred, four teen perches and the usual allon of six per cent for Roads &c; clear of interferences &c.
