



The above Draft included within the black Lines describes a Tract or Parcel of Land Situate in Tannock Township now in the County of Franklin Containing one hundred and eighty nine Acres and 11.5 Perches and Allowance claimed by John Noble on his Warrant bearing Date the 6<sup>th</sup> Day of March 1786, alledging a Right also by an Improvement prior to the Applicants and Surveys of George Ashbridge and Daniel Ashbridge with which it interferes.

The present Survey claimed by Noble include 134 Acres 33 Perches and Allowance of that formerly Survey'd to George Ashbridge on his Application N<sup>o</sup> 5307 Dated December 27<sup>th</sup> 1768 and 55 Acres 12 Perches & Allowance of that formerly Survey'd to Daniel Ashbridge on his Application N<sup>o</sup> 5308 Dated December 27<sup>th</sup> 1768. Survey'd and examined the 2<sup>d</sup> Day of September 1791.
