



By Virtue of a Special Warrant from the Honourable the Proprietors of the Province of Pennsylvania to me directed by Nicholas Scull, Esq^r Surveyor General of the said Province &c. requiring me to survey to Richard Peters Esq^r one of the Executors of Thomas Cookson late of Lancaster Deceased in Trust for the Use of the Devises under his Will two Hundred Acres of Land more or less being an Island in Susquehanna River in the County of Lancaster opposite to Lands late of the said Thomas Cookson in Lancaster County, and the Lands of Cornelius obt^r Jun^r & John Day Esq^r in York County &c. bearing date at Philadelphia the 10th day of October 1755. I have surveyed the said Island for the obt^r acres Richard Peters in Trust for the Use of the Devises under the Testament & last Will of the afores^d Thomas Cookson Deceased containing three Hundred & thirty four acres & the Allowance of six acres p. Cent for Roads & Highways as by this Draught thereof may appear — Surveyed the 5th day of March 1756.
