



These Surveys were both made by my Father (except the closing of the Lines in the Latter Survey between the two Chestnut corners above mark'd A & B. which were done of late) The Boundaries appear'd to be settled in Peace until Walter Wood obtained a Warrant for 50<sup>a</sup> about 2 months ago with Intent to break the latter Survey on Account of some Improvement or Claim formerly made by Geo<sup>o</sup> McCurdy at or near the mark Z which the said McCurdy refused to take in when his Place was Survey'd and was therefore afterwards included in Hugh Thompson's Survey

Situate on the Limestone Road & on the North Boundaries of East Nottingham Township Chester County
