



Measured dated the 5th of July 1734

The Lesser piece of Swamp Beginning at the Victory thence North 31° West by 1/4 Land of Charles Justice 20 p to 1/4 of Wethermark then up the same on its several Courses 24 1/2 perches to a small Ash then South 22° East by Conrad Wethermark's Land 37 p to a plum tree then West by 1/4 Land of Andrew Urin 17° 6 to 1/4 place of Beginning Containing Two Acres and three Quarters

A Draught of two small parcels of Land belonging to David Morton in Darby Township in an Island of Darby Creek Mostly Swamp The Larger Parcel begins at a Plum Tree thence South 14° 40' East by 1/4 Land of Andrew Urin 16° 2 to a Stake then South 60° ^{West} 7° 3 to the end of a Ditch then by 1/4 same South 2 degrees East 31 p to a Stake then South 60 Degrees East 61 perches all by 1/4 said Urin's Ground to an Ash by Darby Creek then up the same on the several Courses thereof 143 p to another piece of 1/4 said Urin's to a Pecinon tree then North 7 2^d West 16° 6 to a stump then South 1° West by Conrad Wethermark's Land 1/2 to a White Oak then South 14° West 5° 6 to a Stump then South 63° 30' West by 1/4 said Conrad's Land 59 pches to 1/4 place of Beginning Containing Eighteen Acres and an Half and Ten perches Survey'd 17th of 3^d mo 1734 Resurveyed the 24th of 8 ber 1734 & Returned into the Secret^{rs} Office the 1st of 9 ber 1734
