



A Draft of A tract of Land situate on the Waters of Dunning's Creek in St. Clair Township Bedford County containing Seven Hundred and thirty six acres and Fifteen perches and allowance of six per Cent for Roads &c Surveyed for John Little on Warrant dated the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of June 1763.

No. 1 represented dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of Land Surveyed for Ephriam Williams on Warrant dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of August 1785 - This tract interferes one Hundred and Twenty five Acres and Eighty two perches with the John Little tract - Ephriam Williams conveyed to Thomas Vickroy from whom it was sold by the Sheriff of Bedford County to Isaac Tictes who devised the same to John Tictes the present owner.

No. 2 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of land Surveyed for James Williams on Warrant dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of August 1785 - this tract interferes four Acres and one hundred and forty two perches with the John Little survey - James Williams conveyed to Thomas Vickroy from whom the same was sold by the Sheriff of Bedford County to Frederick Dupps the present owner.

No. 3 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of A tract of Land Surveyed for Mary Taylor on Warrant dated the 23<sup>rd</sup> day of January 1786 - This tract interferes one Hundred and forty five Acres and Eighty three perches with the John Little survey - Mary Taylor conveyed to Mathew Taylor who conveyed the part aforesaid to William Morehead the present owner.

No. 4 bounded by the dotted and black lines is claimed by virtue of 2 settlements, one made by John Bernheimer thirty five years ago - John Bernheimer conveyed to Samuel Radebush the present owner - The other settlement made by William Morehead twelve years ago or in 1818 - William Morehead is the present Claimant - No surveys have been made on these settlements.

A. B. George Insler obtained a warrant for part of the John Little tract to join Mary Taylor on the West - said Warrant dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of \_\_\_\_\_ 1797 - upon which no survey has been made or returned George Insler conveyed to Peter Insler the present owner.
