



In Pursuance of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 12th day of the First Month 1715 to Lay out unto Reece Thomas of Merion Cent. Four hundred and ninety two Acres of Land in Right of John Clark's Original Purchase. There was Survey'd and Laid out to the said Reece Thomas a certain Tract of Land in York shire in the County of Chester Beginning at a post on the Western side of the Eastern Branch of Brandywine in the Line of Richard Webb's Land Thence South thirty seven degrees West by the same Land seventy perches to a Gum tree again by the said Richard Webb's Land North West by North Eighty perches to a Post Then West South West one hundred and thirty perches to a Black Oak Then South South East by the Land of Thomas Green one hundred and twenty perches to a White Oak Then South by the said Green's Land one hundred and five perches to a Black Oak Then East North East one hundred and thirty perches to a Black Oak Then North East one hundred forty eight perches to a White Oak Thence North West by North one hundred and twenty perches to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred forty two acres with the Allowance of six acres per Cent.

Survey'd December the fifth Anno 1716. Certified at Philadelphia 31st of May 1721 by Jacob Taylor

The land afore mentioned is sold to David Roberts and now in his Possession
