



The Draught of a tract of Land Belonging to J^{no} Hamilton Surveyed the first of September 1763 Beginning at white oak (James Geary's corner) standing in the fork of Swift run and Brush run. Running thence up brush run by Lands of J. Geary and W^m Bawn S 35° E 95 to white oak thence S 14° E 132 to a post in the Great road thence S 1° W 72 to Maple tree standing on the Bank of the run thence by land of Benjamin Bailey (along a road called Cartlidge's road) S 79° W 80 to a black oak thence S 68° W 24 to a W. oak thence S 82° W 20 to a P. oak thence S 66° W 34 to a P. oak thence S 87° W 126 to a m. oak cor^{er} of David Watson's Land thence with the same N 11° E 16 to a W. oak standing on the Bank of Swift run thence Down the same by land of A^x Lewis and Sam^l Miller N 84° E 24 thence N 41° E 32 thence N 16° E 65 thence N 48° E 75 thence N 08° W 70 thence North 40 E 10 thence N 75° E 12 thence N 35 E 110 to the place of Beginning Surveyed P^r
