



At the earnest request of Jacob Hoover of the Township of Warwick in the county of Lancaster Yeoman, I did on the 16th 17th & 18th days of August 1764 with the Assistance of John Seull Deputy Surveyor of that part of the said County Carefully Examine the several Courses Distances & Lines of marked Trees as formerly run & marked (as tis said) by Thomas Cookson Esq^r on a Survey made for s^d Jacob Hoover on his Warr^t of the 12th of April 1745 for 150 acres & found on looking several of the marked Trees in said lines that they were actually made & marked at the time mentioned in the Minutes ^{of Survey} made by s^d Cookson in his field Book & taken from said Field Book by George Stevenson Esq^r one of s^d Cooksons Executors. As may Appear by several Lines as run from a to n in the above Draught But Jacob Inst Claiming part of the s^d Tract of Land to wit a certain Oblong of Upwards of Twenty seven perches in Breadth & Two hundred & fifty perches in Length said Hoover was at our request prevailed on to relinquish the same to him the said Inst.

And these may further Certify that In pursuance of the Now^{ly} the Proprietaries Warrant of Resurvey dated the Ninth day of Oct^r 1764 I have caused the said Land to be resurveyed by John Seull according to the old lines of marked Trees & first Boundaries so made & marked by the said Thomas Cookson & found the same to be situate in Warwick Township aforesaid & bounded as above described in the Draft thereof - Containing two hundred & Eleven acres & fifty nine per^{ches} & allowance of 6 p. Cent for roads
