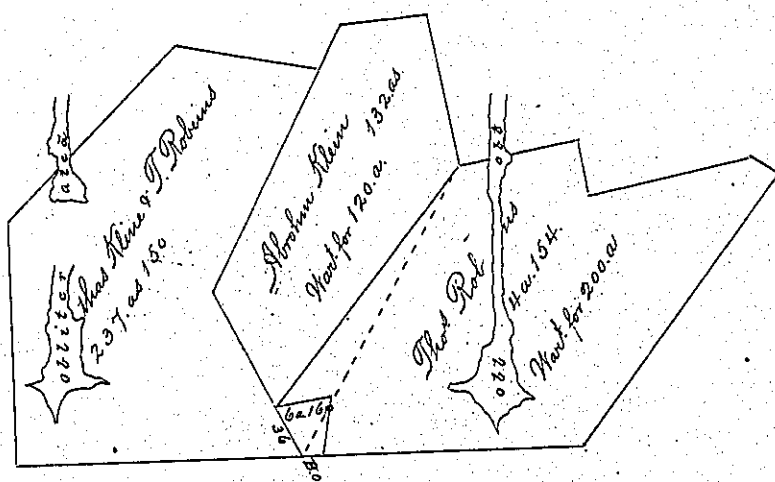

Two of the surveys represented above belong to Tho^s Robins and you will readily perceive the cause of the small survey, the two surveys being a greater quantity than could be Return^d, those surveys were made by me at the Instance of J. Robins, who had Applied for a Patent but was Inform^d that no Return of Survey was made by Gen^l Montgomery by whom the surveys were originally made. I suppose it likely from your representation there are ^{two} set of returns in the office
