No 1 represented by the broken lines is a draft of A tract of land surveyed for Charles Reicher in pursuance of A Warrant dated the 27th day of May 1763 - This survey Interferes Ninety acres & twenty five perches with the Goodley Reicher tract - Charles Reicher's Interest in this tract was sold by the Sheriff of Cumberland County to William Henry who conveyed to John Witherspoon D.D. John Bayward & John Snowden - John Witherspoon conveyed his part to John Bayward & John Snowden who sold ~~the~~ part ~~to~~ Frederick Reicher who conveyed to Conrad Hoover who conveyed to John Gluts the present owner - the residue of this land was sold by Bayward & Snowden to Mathias Smith the present owner -

No 2 represented by the green lines is a draft of A tract of land surveyed for Adam Samuel the 27th day of December 1785 on Warrant dated the 2nd day of November 1774 - This survey interferes One hundred & seven Acres and one hundred & fifty five perches with the Goodley Reicher tract - Adam Samuel's Executors conveyed to Mr. Bear who sold to John Earnest who conveyed to John Fellers the present owner -

No 3 represented by the late Colored lines is a draft of A tract of land surveyed for Adam Samuel on Warrant dated the 29th day of March 1794 - this tract Interferes seven Acres & one hundred & eleven perches with the Goodley Reicher tract - Adam Samuel's executors sold to Mr. Bear who conveyed to John Earnest who conveyed to John Fellers the present owner.
