



Situate on the west side of the Raystown Branch of Juniata Township
 Huntingdon County - containing Seventy five & three fourths acres and allowance of
 six per Cent. Surveyed the 18th day of September 1767 for Joseph Silvers on order
 dated the 1st day of August 1766 N^o 630

The dotted lines represent part of the draught of a survey made for George Roop on
 warrant dated the 7th day of November 1826. This survey interferes Sixty seven and
 one half acres with the Joseph Silvers tract - Thomas Bitteral first improved this tract
 about 30 years ago and conveyed to Augustine Ness - who conveyed to George Roop the present owner.

The residue of the tract was conveyed by Augustine Ness to Leonard Ness the present
 owner and claims under an Improvement made by Thomas Bitteral about 30 years ago.

Note there must be an error in the return draught of Joseph Silvers as there
 must be more than 75 ³/₄ acres contained in it for the Geo. Roop survey interferes 67 ¹/₂
 acres and appears to cover only about half of the ground.
