The red lines represent part of a survey made for Samuel Scott on Warrant dated the 1st February 1794
 This survey interferes one hundred ninety six and one half acres with the Charles Sparks survey - Samuel Scott
 conveyed to William Barton whose heirs lost their title in a law suit to this land.

N^o 1 represents part of a survey made for John Troval by virtue of an Improvement made about
 20 years ago - this survey interferes seventy acres with the Charles Sparks tract. John Troval
 conveyed to Edward Ball who is the present owner.

N^o 2 represents part of a survey made for Jacob Smith on warrant dated the 23rd February 1807 -
 This survey interferes fifty acres with the Charles Smith Sparks tract. Jacob Smith is
 the present owner.

N^o 3 represents part of a survey made for Edward Bell on warrant dated the 9th day of August
 1810 - This survey interferes Ninety two acres and thirty seven perches with the Charles Sparks tract -
 Edward Bell is the present owner.

N^o 4 represents part of a survey made for John Glasco on warrant dated the 2nd day of November
 1810 - This survey interferes one hundred and twenty seven acres and thirty seven perches with the Charles
 Sparks tract - John Glasco is the present owner.
