



Situate in Reading & Hamilton Townships Adams County Surveyed Jan'y 8<sup>th</sup> 1818. In pursuance of an order of Survey granted to Dan<sup>l</sup> Slagle for 250<sup>a</sup> N<sup>o</sup> 5138 dated August ~~25<sup>th</sup>~~ 26<sup>th</sup> 1768 containing two hundred & twenty one acres one hundred & twelve perches & all. Daniel Slagle took 2 warrants dated December 15<sup>th</sup> 1792 for land in Reading Township which by their description of the land appears to have been taken for the part of this land which lies in Reading Township which contains about 206<sup>a</sup> 71<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ps & all and 27<sup>a</sup> 86 ps which is part of 116<sup>a</sup> sur<sup>d</sup> on warrant to Dan<sup>l</sup> Slagle dated August 20<sup>th</sup> 1747 making together 234<sup>a</sup> & all.
