



Description of the Newtown Common
 Beginning at a stone formerly placed in a stump of an original Corner Black oak thence S 83° 30' E. crossing the Newtown Creek and running by the land of Aaron Philips originally James Gates 35 perches to a stone now set over the Bristol road in the line of Joseph Worstall's lot thence along the same and the line of survey Lots of the said Town of the lands originally Shadrack Walley Mary Kayworth & Jonathan Eldridge's N. 8° 15' E 211.4 perches to a stone now set as a corner of the land of Samson Cary originally Tho. Wilborn's as also for a corner of the seven acres belonging to and now surveyed to Francis Murray Esq. thence by the same N. 80° W. 29.8 profing again the said Creek to a stone now set as another corner thereof on the Westerly side of the Taylor's ferry road at its intersection with the Durham road about the corner between the lands of Moses Kelly orig. Ezra Crossdale's and Jacob Buckman orig. Samuel Houghs thence by the said Buckman's and by lands of James Harnas Esq. Thomas Buckman Jesse Leddon & others orig. Michael Houghs Wm. Buckman's & Stephen Timings S. 9° 38' W. 213.4 perches to the place of Beg. Containing 140 acres & 97 perches & the allowance General Murray's seven acres

Beginning at a stone now set as a corner on the Westerly side of Taylor's ferry road at the intersection of the Durham road about the corner between the lands of Moses Kelly & Jacob Buckman thence by the lands now surveyed as the Common S 80° E 29.8 to a stone now set as another corner thereof and a corner of the lands of Samson Cary originally Thomas Wilborn's thence by the said Cary's land N. 8° 15' E 38.2 to a post thence by the said Cary's land orig. John Frosts along an old ditch N. 65° W. 28.4 to a post in the line of the said Murray's land over the said ferry road 4.4 perches beyond the the corner of the said Cary land which only extends to the Easterly side of the said road thence by the land of the said Murray & said Kelly originally Ezra Crossdale's on the Westerly side of the said road S 11° 38' W. 45.5 to the place of Beginning Containing seven acres & the allowance
 To Daniel Brodhead, Esquire Surveyor Genl.
