



A Draught of a Tract of Land Marked B. Situate in Reading Township in the County of York. Surveyed the 25th June 1789 agreeably to the Old lines formerly run by Thomas Amnor containing Eighty Nine Acres and Eighty Nine perches and the usual allowance of Six Acres p cent. for Roads &c. See the General Draught.

N.B. There is Two Warrants for this tract of land both in the name of John Least one of which bears date the 22^d May 1751 for 50 Acres. on this Warrant it appears by Thomas Amnor's Fieldbook that he (Amnor) surveyed to John Least one Hundred and seven Acres. which Survey is dated the 12th day of June 1753. The Other Warrant for the said Tract was taken out by the said John Least or by his son in his name, the 11th day of June 1789 Granted for 107^{ac} on this Warrant he called on to Survey the said Tract and return it and either Wishes to patent on the Old or new, but says, and also shewed me a number of Depositions to prove that the small Piece Marked with the letter A (in the General Draught herewith) was also Surveyed to the said first 50^{ac} above mentioned, but I can find no record nor Draught for it. Jacob Bruch has a Warrant for the said small Piece Marked with the letter A in the said General Draught herewith Dated the 16th day of January on which Warrant I have Returned fifteen and one Quarter acres and allowance See the Return in the Surveyor Generals Office.
