



By Virtue of a Warrant Dated at Philadelphia on the 30<sup>th</sup> Day of August Anno-1753-- granted to Christian Curre. The above described Two Tracts of Land Situate in Maccougy Township in the County of Northampton and Province of Pennsylvania. The first Containing Nineteen Acres and 140 perches of Land with the usual allowance, and the second Containing Twenty six acres and 85 perches with the allowance. Both together Containing forty six Acres and 65 perches of Land together with the usual Allowance at six per Cent for Roads were Surveyed for the said Christian Curre. (But are now to be granted to his son George) on the 18<sup>th</sup> Day of November, Anno, 1756. By order of Mr. William Parsons Esquire p David Shultze
